- And it allows children to explore the power of words, forming a bridge into the world of writing

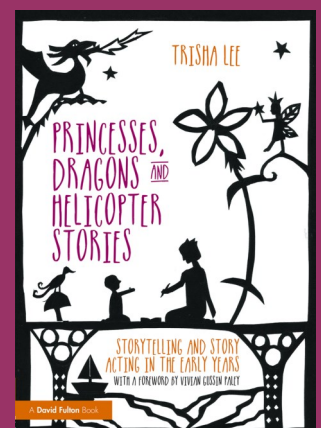
